# Elimination of Mother -to- Child Transmission (EMTCT)

Today we register a success in this program of EMTCT of HIV/AIDS among HIV positive mothers that are on our care. We are extremely happy to share with you our success for 2013 as 75 new pregnant mothers who were registered on our program all gave birth to HIV negative children. We congratulate our dedicated staff especially the clinicians and the program sponsor who have provided these new babies with a great start to their lives. The mothers are educated in areas such as preventing the transfer of the disease to their child during pregnancy, infant feeding, Adherence counselling, positive living for mothers and children, nutrition for people living with HIV/AIDS, opportunistic infections and so much more. The mothers are also followed up and monitored.

## Income Generating Activities

We would like to thank all of you for supporting our income generating projects at KHC in 2013. We currently have in stock Beads, Mushrooms, and liquid soap. Many of our clients who have for the past year been raising pigs now have piglets due and they will be giving to KHC 2 piglets from the litter which will be given to other clients to raise. We have also been able to support more clients in the project by providing feed



for the first 3 months and veterinary services.

# End of year parties at KHC



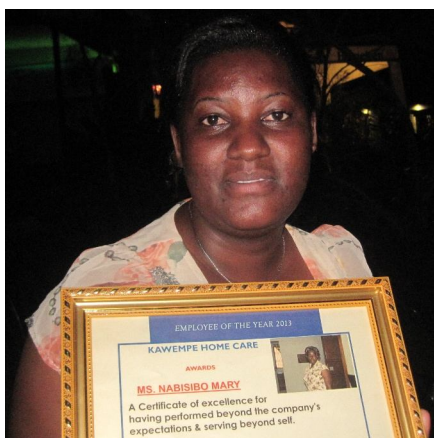
